

Do geopolitical uncertainties contribute to an increase in applications for annulments of arbitral awards?

Application Rate:

+ 1971-2000: 22%

÷ 2001-2010: 35%

+ 2011-2020: 51%

+ 2021-2023: 48%

Which side is applying?

- + Respondent files 62% of applications
- + While only about 48% of awards uphold claims in part or in full

Do geopolitical uncertainties contribute to an increase in noncompliance with Awards?

The International Rule of Law Compliance Index, based on our Report, ranks the top 20 countries in terms of adverse ISDS Awards, which have not been paid. By refusing to pay those Awards, Respondent States fail to fulfil their international law obligations, thereby undermining the International Rule of Law.

In this context, it is particularly alarming to note that several EU Member States feature in the top 20 list (marked in red), thereby highlighting the fact that the Rule of Law standard within the EU is increasingly backsliding.⁶

Mr. McCaul (for himself, Ms. Kaptur, Mr. Wilson of South Carolina, Mr. Cohen, Mr. Kean of New Jersey, Mr. Quigley, and Mr. Fitzpatrick) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committees on Rules, and Financial Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

ABILL

To authorize the Secretary of State to provide additional assistance to Ukraine using assets confiscated from the Central Bank of the Russian Federation and other sovereign assets of the Russian Federation, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.

(a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the "Rebuilding Economic Prosperity and Opportunity for Ukrainians Act" or the "REPO for Ukrainians Act"

The REPO for Ukrainians Act:

- + Part of the recent foreign aid funding passed by the US House;
- + Seeks to use the seized Russian sovereign assets for re-construction in Ukraine;
- + Unclear if award creditors will be able to utilise this Act;
- + But parts of it are written broadly.
